Four Corners

Grades K-5

BENEFIT

Listening skills, concentration skills

LOCATION

Blacktop, grass, multipurpose room, classroom

EQUIPMENT

Four cones

- Use four cones to establish a small square playing area (roughly 50 feet by 50 feet; the painted lines of a basketball court also work well). Set a cone in each corner. Pick a student to sit in the middle of the court with his eyes closed. The other students stand along one side of the playing area.
- Once the student in the middle has covered his eyes, the other students disperse to the four corners, tiptoeing quietly. Each student chooses a corner independently and stands by a cone. The student in the middle listens closely as his classmates move. Once everyone has reached a corner, the middle student points to the corner he thinks has the most students.
- If he picks the corner with the most students, he gets to stay in the middle for another round. If not, select another student to sit in the middle.



The student in the middle must cover his eyes and point to the corner he thinks has the most students.
